

Testimonial Report on Feeding Celmanax® at the School of Veterinary Medicine Dairy, University of Wisconsin-Madison

“Celmanax® is a non-antibiotic remedy with no fear of doing harm to the animals”, according to Dr. Sheila McGuirk DVM, Ph.D from University of Wisconsin School Veterinary of Medicine. Sheila and Dr. Keith Poulson, DVM, have been using Celmanax Liquid at the UW School of Veterinary Medicine in Madison, WI., for over 2 years, administered either as a top dress, in an oral drench, or directly by mouth.

Cows that are admitted to their Veterinary Medical Teaching hospital for diagnostic work or treatment of an illness are usually given Celmanax as part of their supportive care. For cows that are eating, 30 ml (1 oz) is top dressed on their haylage or silage while cows that are off feed or eating poorly are given Celmanax Liquid either by mouth or in a fluid drench that is designed to treat ketosis, rehydrate them and/or stimulate rumen activity.

From down cows, cows recovering from surgery or cows with *Salmonellosis*, they have developed a confidence in the product as part of the treatment to get cows back to full feed and normal rumen activity. All cows at the Veterinary Medical Teaching hospital, are monitored twice a day by vital signs, milk production, and manure consistency and output.
